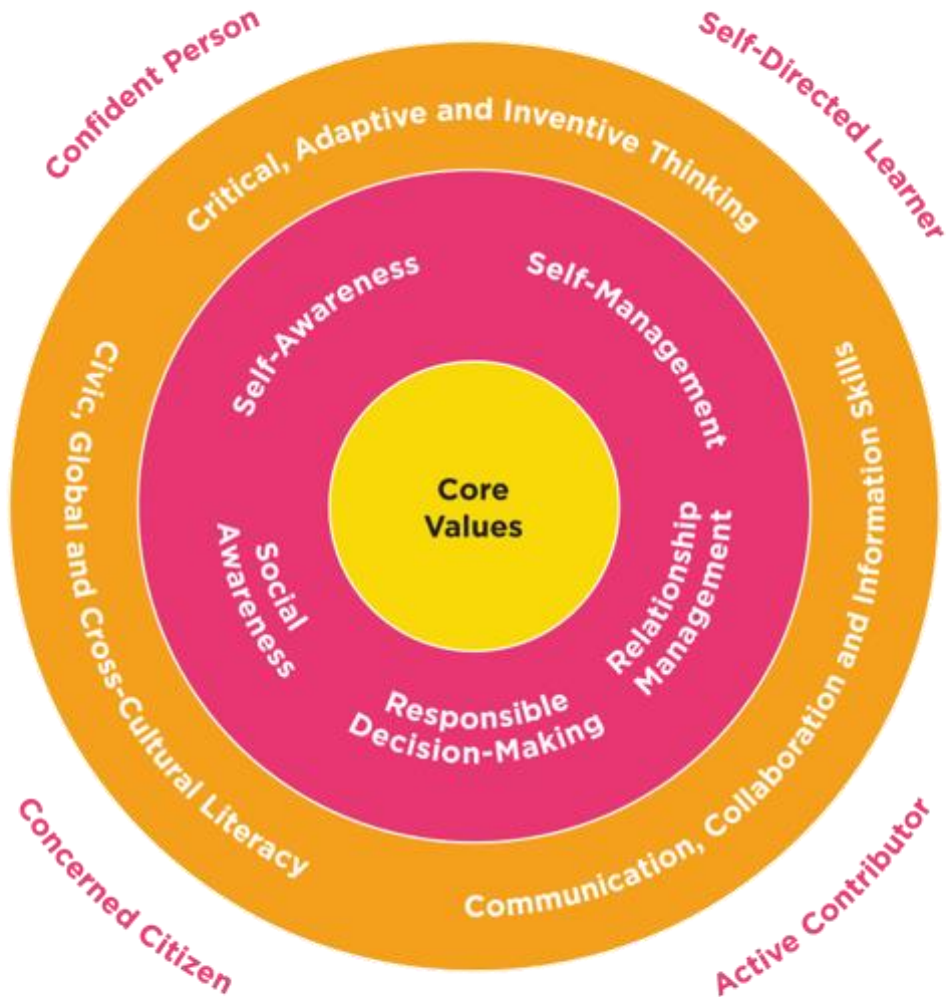

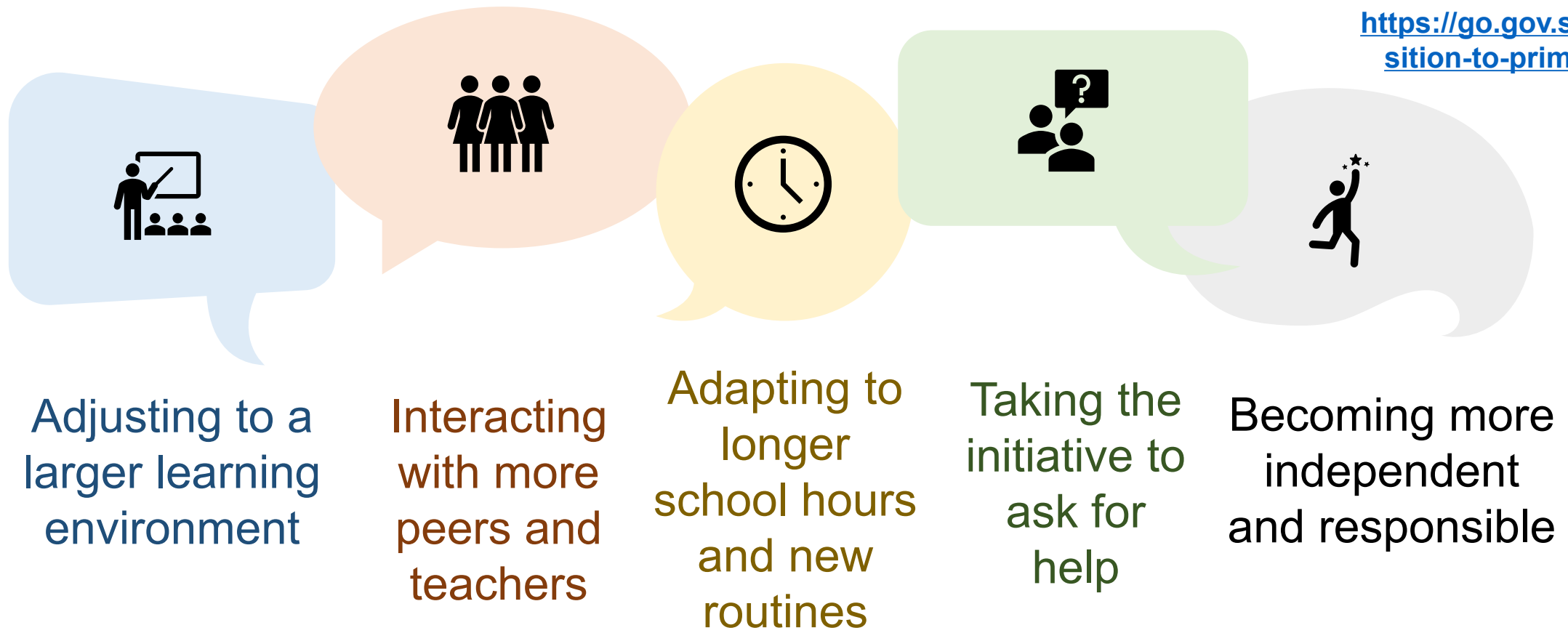

Preparing your child for PI: Some big ideas

- Focus on the emotional and social preparation
- Do not over-prepare your child academically
 - If your child has already learnt everything that will be taught, he/she will be bored and will not enjoy going to school

Some questions you may have...

What if my child is unable to cope with the P1 curriculum?

Stay calm, be patient and supportive.
(If you are anxious, your child will feel anxious.)

Work with the teacher.

Affirm your child's efforts and celebrate little successes.

Assurance for parents

- In Term 1, the P1 curriculum revisits what the children learnt in kindergarten: Teachers revise
 - the letters of the alphabet and common words
 - Numbers 1-10
- No spelling in Term 1
- Mother Tongue: focus on oracy, listening skills, enjoying the language through games, stories, songs

Assurance for parents

- Teachers are trained to provide differentiated support for children
 - they recognize that each child is different and will give them time to adjust
- Teachers will spend more time with children who need more support

Some questions you may have...



Practise with your child when and how to ask for help. Remember to affirm them for their efforts.

Asking for help may not seem obvious to a child.

Teach your child how to ask for help:

Step 1: Look for someone who can help

Step 2: Share what the problem is and how they feel

Step 3: Listen carefully to the advice given

Step 4: Thank the person for the help

Some questions you may have...

What if my child is unable to make new friends in school?

Teach your child to make friends by engaging in role play: 'Hello, my name is John. What is your name?'

Ask your child to find common interests with peers by asking them what they like.

If you know your child is very shy, please inform the form teacher on the first day of school.

What our school does

- Class bonding activities the first week of school – provide opportunities for students to get to know their classmates
- If a teacher notices that a child is very shy, the teacher will pair the child with classmates seated nearby

Some questions you may have...

*What if my child is
unable to make new
friends in school?*

What our school does

- The teacher may also match the child with other students or encourage classmates to approach the child.
- The teacher will involve the child in class activities and affirm the child.

Some questions you may have...

What if my child is bullied or called names?

Teach your child the following

- Stop - Ask the person to stop
- Walk away
- Tell a teacher

What our school does

- We have a zero tolerance for bullying in our school
- We educate our students about values, social skills, responsible decision-making and how to respond to bullying.

Some questions you may have...

What if my child is bullied or called names?

Teach your child the following

- Stop - Ask the person to stop
- Walk away
- Tell a teacher

What our school does

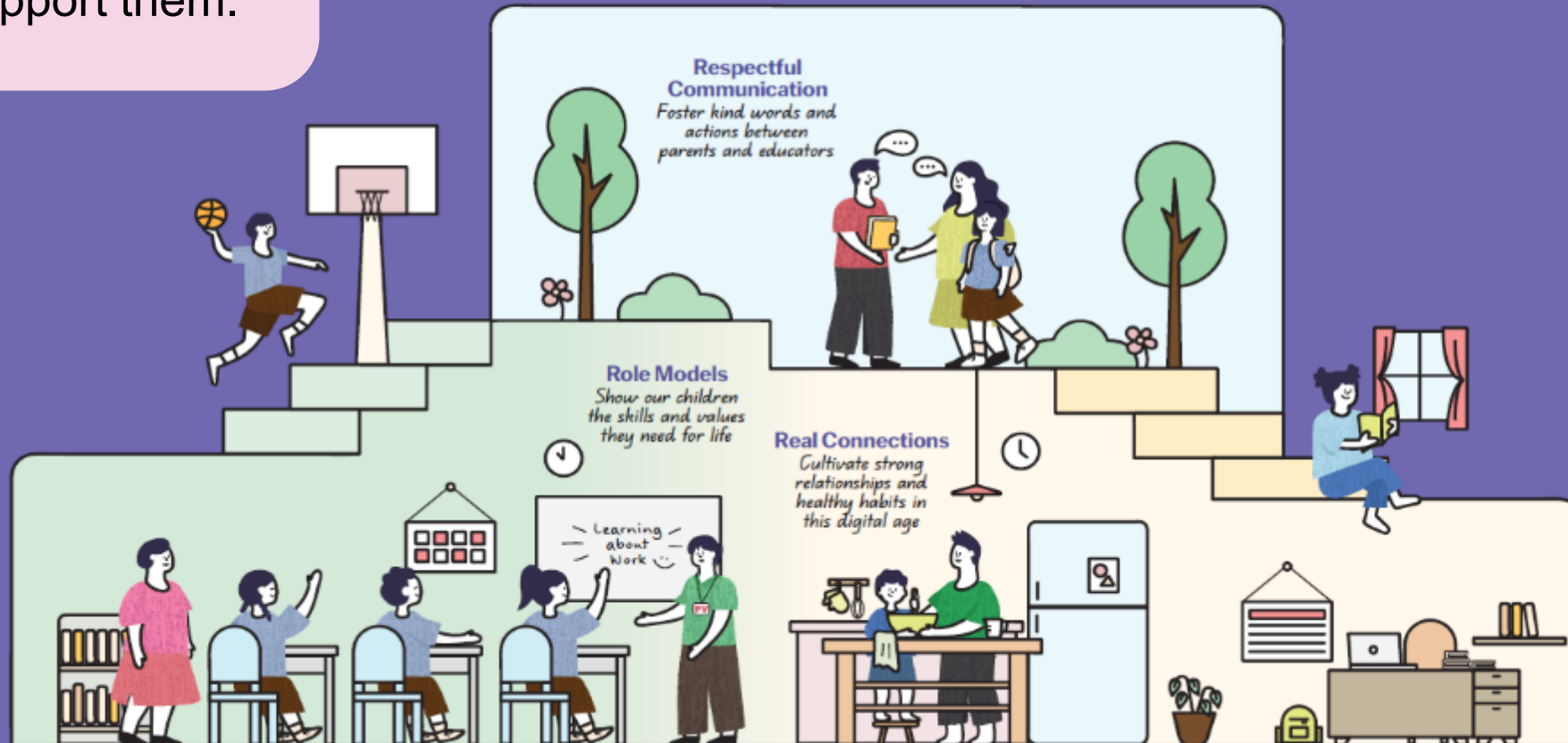
- We address the bullying and inappropriate speech/behaviour once it is reported to us.

What we would appreciate from parents: 3Cs and 1B

When your child tells you something that alarms you

- keep **Calm**
- remain **Courteous**
- **Communicate** your concerns to the teacher directly and constructively
- Give the teacher or classmate the **Benefit of the doubt**
 - Could it be a misunderstanding or misinterpretation of words said? Is there more than one side to the story?
 - We don't have perfect teachers but we have teachers who care for the students and have the students' interests at heart.

Model good values in words and actions



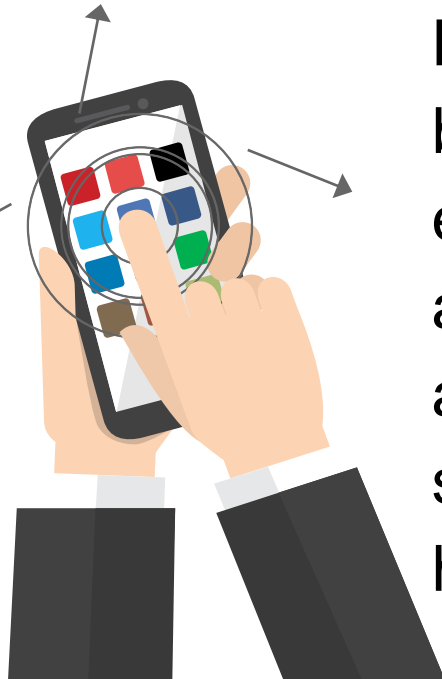

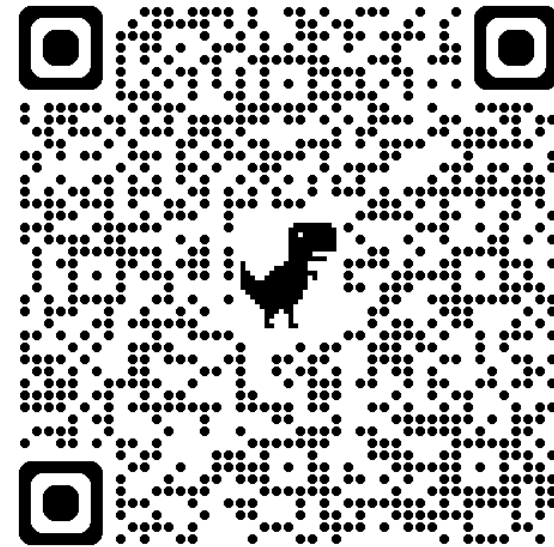
