



  - The PCTC gives students a voice in communicating their learning and progress to parents.

When your child tells you something that alarms you

- keep <u>Calm</u>
- remain <u>Courteous</u>
- <u>Communicate</u> your concerns to the teacher directly and constructively
- Give the teacher or classmate the <u>Benefit of the doubt</u>
  - Could it be a misunderstanding or misinterpretation of words said? Is there more than one side to the story?
  - We don't have perfect teachers but we have teachers who care for the students and have the students' interests at heart.

# Character & Citizenship Education (CCE): School-Parent Partnership

- ask your child to share with you what he/she learnt and applied from the Assembly Talks, Form Teacher Guidance Periods (FTGP) and Values-in-Action (VIA) projects
- remind your child to be respectful and helpful to teachers and schoolmates
- reinforce school values when teachable moments arise
- Give your child opportunities to live out our school values, e.g.
  - Helping with household chores, taking care of siblings

# Character & Citizenship Education (CCE): School-Parent Partnership

Values are both taught and caught

- Let us be good role models for our children and lead by example our children are watching us
  - Let us speak to all staff with respect and courtesy
  - If we are upset about something, let us be mindful of our language and express our concerns tactfully via the appropriate channels
  - do acts of kindness and practise care for the environment with your children so that they have opportunities to live out our school values: e.g.
    - spending time with grandparents, showing kindness to neighbours, giving care packs to migrant workers
    - practising the 3Rs (Reduce-Reuse-Recycle), returning trays and wiping down the table at the hawker centre

#### CCE: School-Parent Partnership

- encourage your children to be responsible learners and show care for their teachers by doing their homework without being reminded and putting in their best effort
- this will definitely make a difference to the teachers' workload and well-being
- lead by example and show care towards our teachers
  - teachers will respond to parents' emails or calls on weekdays between 7.00 am to 5.00 pm, unless there is an emergency or a serious matter
  - please respect teachers' personal time and do not send text messages or call them at night or on weekends unless it is an emergency or a serious matter

# Nurturing self-directed lifelong learners : School-Parent Partnership

### Affirm your children when you see them

- Iearning something new and not giving up even when it's difficult
- being self-directed in their learning, e.g.
  - Doing their homework and revision without reminders
  - Accessing the Student Learning Space (SLS) and other learning platforms to reinforce and extend their learning or explore their interests
- Help your children see connections between what they learn and everyday life
  - E.g. shopping, baking and cooking; visits to the park, cycling

Nurturing self-directed lifelong learners: School-Parent Partnership

- Encourage your children to be curious and observant, to ask questions
  - If you don't know the answers, tell them: "let's learn and find out together"
- Be a role model to your children as a lifelong learner: share with them your stories as a lifelong learner, e.g.
  - Learning new skills
  - Taking SkillsFuture or other courses
  - Re-training for new jobs

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# Allow your child to enjoy his/her childhood

Don't be 'kiasu'

- allow your child to enjoy his/her childhood
  - Time for play and hobbies
- take a long-term view:
  - How will he/she best be prepared for life? What is best for his/her growth & development?
    - Stimulate your child's curiosity and love for reading & learning
    - Values education, developing social-emotional skills
